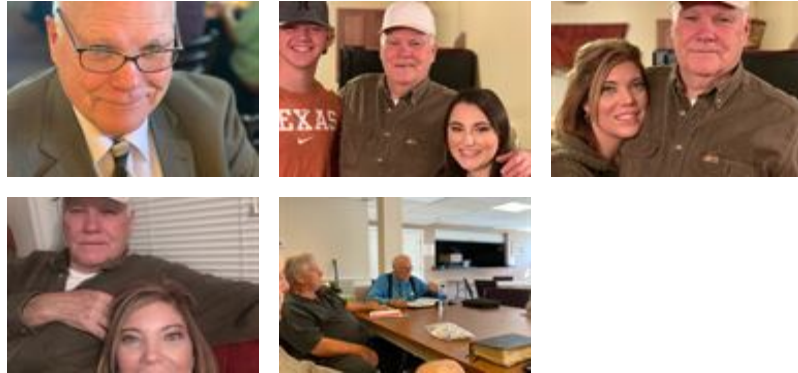
“ *Janice, Billy, Francie and family,*
