Gregory Faulkner, 50, passed away Sunday, February 23, 2025 at University of Kentucky Medical Center, Lexington. He was born August 12, 1974 to Rev. Scoby Faulkner and the late Dorothy Louise Rogers Faulkner. Greg was a self taught accomplished pianist beginning at five years old, having never taken a lesson. Playing in numerous music groups he shared his talents around the country. 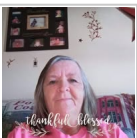
