On Saturday, December 13th, Karen Sue Spencer Graham departed this world and returned to the arms of God, reunited at last with those who went before her. She is survived by her

beloved son, Cory Graham, her cherished grandson, Charleston Graham, who was the light of

her later years. Additionally, her sisters, Louise Grounds, Barbara (Jim) McPhail, and

Teresa Spencer; her nieces, Valerie (Jack) Ellis and Stacy King; and her great-nieces and great-

nephews, Jackson (Hailey) Ellis, Lauren Ellis, and Samuel King. She was preceded in death by: parents Thomas & Delphia Harper Spencer; sister Carol King; and brother-in-law Dennis Grounds.

A daughter of Appalachia in the truest sense, she was born in the coal camps of Cabin Creek,

West Virginia, and came of age in the turbulent 1960s, years that shaped her convictions, her

compassion, and the woman she would become. Above all things, she championed kindness.

Fearing it was slipping from the world, and she made it her quiet mission to remind everyone

around her never to lose sight of its worth.

Her love extended not only to the people in her life but to the animals she

cherished. Generous
at her core, and a devoted vegan for nearly the whole of her life, she found
beauty in every
living creature, even the odd sea animals collected by her grandson, whom
she affectionately
claimed as her “great-grand fish.” Like them, she found her own peace and joy
in the warmth
and the waves of the ocean.
Her years in Powell County were marked by service from the very beginning.
During her long
career with the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, she
dedicated herself to
the farmers and homemakers she often spoke of as family, and to the
countless community
members who came to her seeking help. Later, she honored her dear friend
Rhonda Allen
Barnett by completing her term as Powell County Clerk, guiding the county
through the end of
prohibition before retiring to devote her days more fully to those she loved.
As a mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, daughter, and cousin, Karen placed
her family at the
center of her life. As a public servant, advocate, and proud member of the
Powell County
Democratic Hall of Fame, she held her community just as close to her heart.
But above all else,
simply as a human being, it was that very heart that shone brightest. It is that
quiet brilliance,
that unmistakable warmth, that will be missed most of all.
Her passing may cast a shadow, but her memory remains a steady beacon
guiding us,
comforting us, and reminding us of the way home. She was loved dearly, and

her spirit will

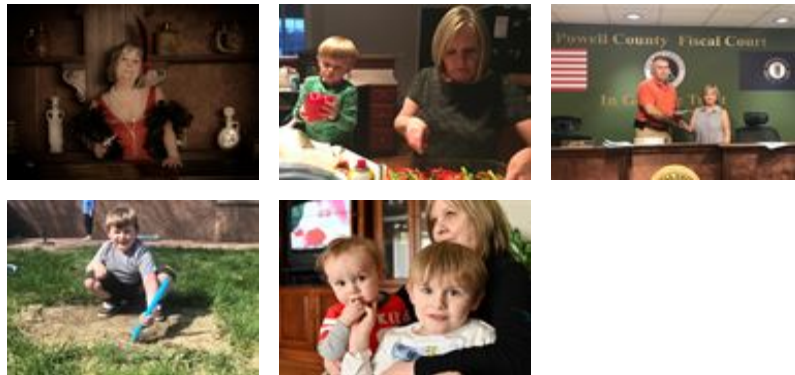

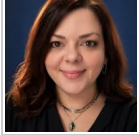
