“ I was thinking of Brother Adams and some of his songs the other day. I decided to try to look up some of the family, but was unable to get a phone number or address. I want to leave a story for the family that they might know if they get back on here and see it.

My mom and dad were friends of this family since I can remember. Dad and Brother Adams have traveled many miles together and preached for each other many times. But what many might not know was how my dad came to the Lord and really made a life commitment.

We had known Brother Adams in Florida and even attended his church many times. I can remember sitting on the floor watching Rhonda play the accordion and can remember them singing in Grandma Hensley's church, "I See A Bridge, A Way To Cross The River Of Strife".

Dad left Florida and moved us to a little town in western Virginia. He was not serving he Lord and had leased a small restaurant. What many don't know was that he was planning on leaving us after he closed the restaurant one evening. No one new about this except for the friend he was going to ride with. On the night he planned to go, they had closed up and Dad was cleaning the grill and the waitress was cleaning the front. She forgot to lock the door and as dad was cleaning the grill in the back, he heard someone come in the door. He heard a man's voice ask the waitress for coffee and directions. The voice sounded familiar and dad looked out through the serving window and there stood Brother Adams. He was beginning a revival in the next town. When dad saw him, he came out to say hello. Brother Adams told him why he was there and said that instead of renting a motel, he would stay with us, without an invitation from dad. (HaHa-we were that kind of friends) Dad was not going to let that change his plans and told Brother a Adams how to get to the house and that he would come after he finished. Brother Adams refused saying he would just wait and follow dad. Dad gave his life to God and was called to preach in that revival.

Some would say that was just coincidence, but I want to point out a few things. The outside lights were off at the restaurant, the door was suppose to be locked, and the man that stopped just happened to be a Holy Ghost filled preacher. No way that was coincidence, it was the hand of God.

They rode many miles together after that. Both are now in heaven enjoying the presence of God. I loved this man like a second dad. I've had the honor of preaching for him and one of the greatest revivals I ever preached was at his church.

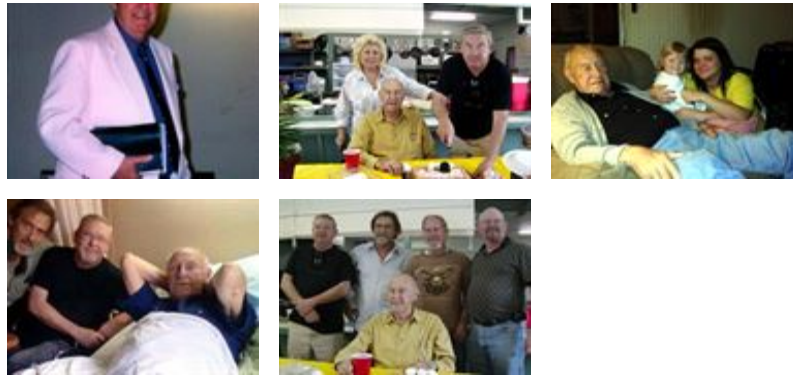
